By maximizing change through collective impact, Arts Connect ensures that the entire community understands the fundamental necessity of the arts for all children. Using data, advocating for change, building capacity, and opening avenues for strategic funding, the initiative creates new pathways for students, schools, and districts to embrace high-quality arts education. With over 80 partners, the collective aligns seven primary stakeholder groups including local arts and culture organizations, Houston ISD, the City of Houston, the Houston Arts Alliance, the local philanthropic community, state and national partners, and community members.

Arts Connect advocates for the vital role of the arts within education to ensure that all HISD students have access to a high-quality arts education. Most recently, Arts Connect helped ensure HISD was providing arts educators in high needs schools.



Building Capacity

Arts Connect helps educators and nonprofits do better work in schools through trainings, the Arts Action Fund and other capacity building services. In this way, dozens of cooperating partners get better together and do better together.

Arts Connect taps untapped public and private funds in Houston—and across the country—to unlock new resources, allowing the collective to achieve systems change, eradicate arts education disparities, support innovation, and amplify capacity building efforts.



COLLECTIVE ACTION TOWARDS EQUITY

Arts Connect's systemic approach to education access has profound effects inside and outside of the classroom. Beyond the necessity of the arts as part of a complete education for all students, it shines a light on issues of access and equity by addressing disparities in resource allocation that disproportionately impact students of color. Because arts education is a proven way to bolster student success across socioeconomic factors, disinvesting in the arts deepens already widening gaps in achievement. The results of these inequities have far-reaching consequences for the health of students' communities and for their lives outside of school.

Equity Matters: Arts Education and Student Impacts

- When conducted rigorously, research shows that the arts improve student engagement, attendance, critical thinking skills, writing achievement, empathy, compassion and tolerance, among others.
- When we look at the impact of arts learning by student success by subgroups, we find effects that are substantially greater in magnitude-in many cases two to three times- when compared to the general student population.
- When we provide arts learning opportunities, schools are compensating for learning opportunities that would not otherwise be taking place for historically marginalized students.
